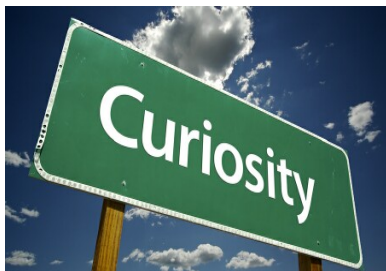

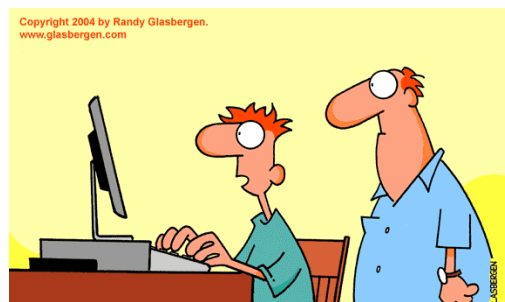

Preparation for the First Term Exam

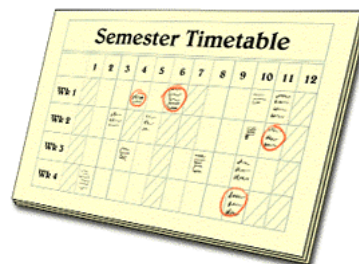
Good morning Principal, Vice-Principals, teachers and fellow schoolmates. Today I would like to share about the methods of studying.

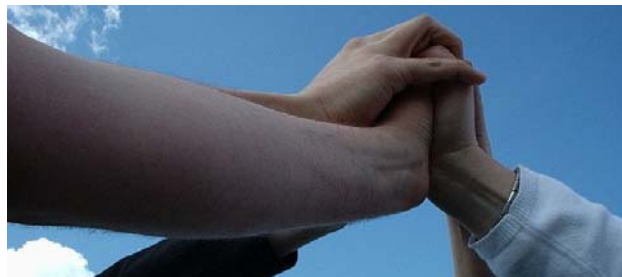

Tobacco Duty

They suggested that the tax should take up at least 75 percent of the price of a pack of cigarettes. If this suggestion is adopted, a pack of cigarettes could cost up to 60 Hong Kong dollars. In my opinion, this is a good suggestion and Mr.

Tsang should consider it in his upcoming budget. Raising the tax is indeed beneficial. First, it can force the smokers to quit smoking so that both the smokers and the public can be healthier. Thus, the government would have less pressure on medical services and the government could have more money from the tax so that the government could spend more budgets to solve the other problems. A public Outrage of DSS School

Recently I have read there was a public outrage caused by the audit reports of a DSS school (direct-subsidy-scheme school).

The reports showed that several DSS schools had received the subsidy from the government, and used to invest in stocks or securities to make profits that sometimes reached billions of dollars

Besides, the audits showed that some schools used the profits to make expenditure for personal gain rather than re-invest in improvement of the quality of education. I believe this is the main reason that caused such public outrage, as the money comes from taxpayer.

Furthermore, there is a better way to use the capital. The government can subsidize the other schools which are lacking of capital to enhance their quality.

Finally, the DSS schools should either run by themselves which they are not receiving any governmental subsidy, or invest in training teachers and upgrading equipments so that they can improve their quality. Also they have a moral obligation to increase the transparency of their financial dealings, especially since they have applied for subsidy from the government, and use the subsidy for the right purposes.

The Culling Problem of Green Sea Turtles in Hainan Island

For the past decade the government hasn't taken much interest in the issue of air pollution until "The Action Blue Sky" which was launched recently. It is such a pity that either the roadside pollution or the air pollution index which are reported everyday during the weather forecast continuously shows the upsetting results in which it is always at either "very high" or even "severe" levels. Such irrefutable facts prove that the Hong Kong government has not done enough to fight the air pollution problem. It doesn't seem to be taking it

seriously even though the former Chief Executive Tung Chee-Hwa declared that solving air pollution problems would be a priority in his 1999 policy address. In Hong Kong, the main reason behind air pollution is vehicles such as the old buses and minibuses. However, the government still lets these automobiles continue to be in service. It's such an absurd decision made by the government as they expect all these old vehicles will be eliminated by 2019 according to the Secretary for the Environment Mr. Edward Yau. Personally, I think that such an expectation is ridiculous.

By the way, the Government believes that the introduction of the LPG taxis and minibuses, Euro IV and V environmentally friendly buses can achieve an obvious effect on the purification of the air. How ridiculous and naive is that?

On the other hand, other foreign countries, such as Germany, Italy and Britain have enforced stern rules and laws on the emissions of vehicles. At first, some supercar manufacturers opposed the enforcement of such rules. Later on, they started to cope with the government decisions and invented some automobiles which proved that they had made a breakthrough on the limitation of speed and acceleration even though the vehicles were either hybrid or electrical. For these supercars, there are some good examples such as the Ferrari 430 Bio-fuel, 599 hybrid, the Porsche 918 RSR hybrid, the



Bern SLS E-cell and finally the product of the Hong Kong Polytechnic University so called "My Car". Having looked at these inventions, I would like to ask a question, "Why do the manufacturers in Europe have such insane creations but not Hong Kong?" What is the reason that they can adapt their products to a race car but the Polytechnic "My Car" can only has a maximum speed up to 50 km/h? We don't have such crazy exotic cars, but why does the government not allow the universities to obtain enough resources to invent some other environmentally friendly cars apart from the hybrid and electrical ones? Maybe one day in the future, Hong Kong will uncover a car which runs on air or hydrogen.

The main problem is that we Hong kongers don't pay much attention to the crying and screaming of the earth and the environment.

Finally, I just want to conclude and advise citizens in Hong Kong and the Hong Kong Government that we are all part of the earth. We should cooperate and take up the responsibility to take care of the environment and conserve it with all our efforts. We should put our commitment into practice by taking the first step which is to cut down the emissions from vehicles immediately. 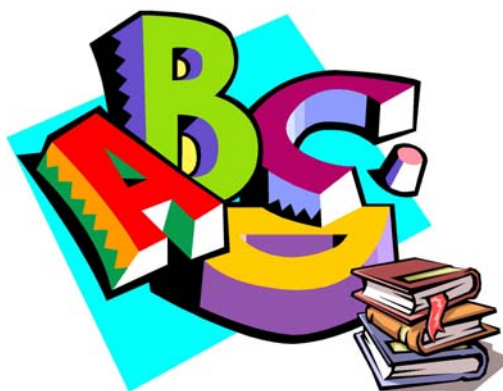

The reason why I shared doomsday with you is not to scare you and to tell you to get ready

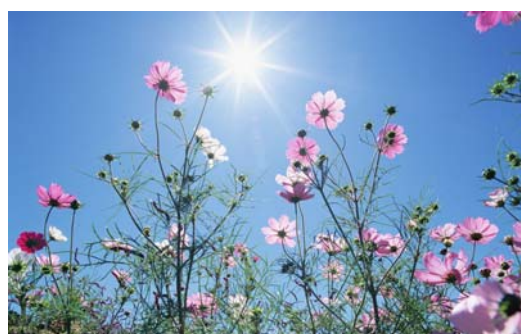

Good morning Principal, Vice-Principals, teachers and fellow schoolmates,

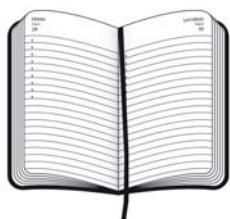

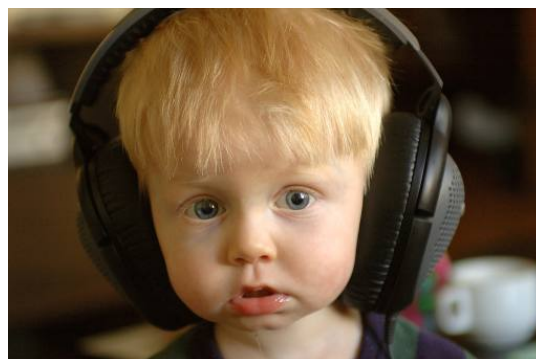

Good morning, principal, vice principle, teachers and my fellow schoolmates. Today I would like to share with you about the interactive drama held in September.

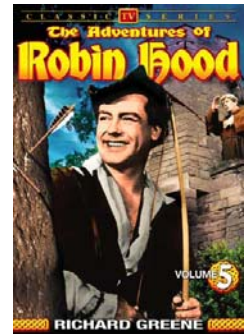
