Mr. Kung, Vice-principals, teachers and fellow schoolmates, good morning. I'm glad to have this chance to stand here and share some of my feelings about being a prefect in this school.

Have you ever thought of being a prefect? Being a prefect is always my dream since I was still a form one boy. And I was so delighted when I knew that my dream comes true this year. How wonderful it is!

To my mind, being prefects is different from other school duties such as school librarians and peer-counselors. Prefects have to bear more responsibilities and yet it is much stressful.
