Speaking of tenacity, I think, Paul's late mother, Mrs Mary McCartney, passed on a wonderfully pragmatic element to the family. She once said that hard work and tenacity are the principal keys to achievement. If we look back to what this legend has done, for example, writing plenty of euphonious songs over the past six decades and enduring the terrible accommodation in Hamburg, he deserves my admiration.

So, for those who also admire Paul McCartney or the Beatles, this is a book you must read.
