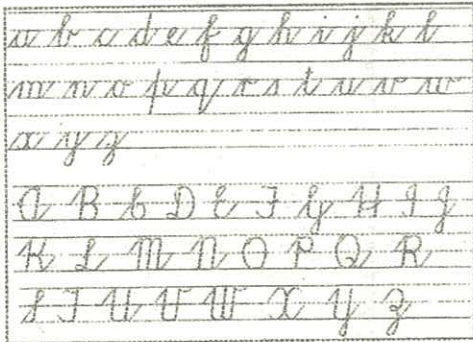


The Man in the Wilderness anonymous
