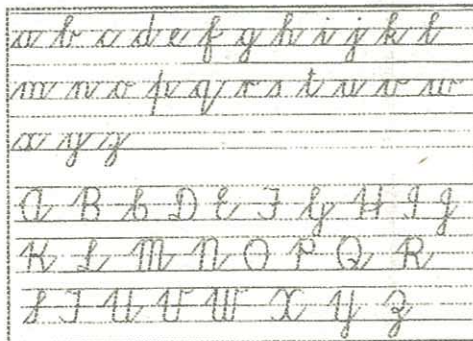


**The Man in the Wilderness** anonymous
